IT 100 INTERNET USE POLICY

The County of Prince Edward Public Library & Archives provides access to the internet to fulfill its mission to preserve and promote universal access to a broad range of human knowledge, experience, information, and ideas.

The Internet enables the Library to connect electronically to ideas, information and commentary from around the globe and to offer access to many valuable local, national and international resources.

The Internet is an unregulated, worldwide environment. It contains information and opinions that range in scope from reliable and authoritative to controversial or extremely offensive. Some information found on the Internet may NOT be accurate, complete, or current. Users must assess the validity of the information found. Users should be aware that the Internet is not a secure medium and that third parties may be able to obtain information about users' activities. The Library assumes no responsibility for the security and privacy of on-line transactions.

Children are entitled to access all information and facilities in the Library. As with other library materials, children's access to the Internet and other electronic networks is the responsibility of parents or guardians.

The Library does not manage the content of the information accessed through the Internet and assumes responsibility only for the information provided on its own home pages. The County of Prince Edward Public Library & Archives assumes no responsibility for any direct or indirect claims, damages or costs, howsoever caused, sought

by users or third parties arising from its provision of access to Internet services.

The County of Prince Edward Public Library's users are subject to federal, provincial and municipal legislation regulating Internet use, including the provisions of the ***Criminal Code*** regarding obscenity, child pornography, sedition and the incitement of hate. The use of Library's Internet services for illegal purposes is prohibited, and may result in prosecution.

To ensure equitable access to the Internet and efficient use of the resources, the Library has developed policy for its use. The Library reserves the right to modify these policies when and where appropriate.

Certain copying or distribution of material found on the Internet may infringe copyright or other intellectual property rights. The Library is not responsible for such infringements.

Internet workstations are situated in public areas, and users are expected to use the Internet in accordance with this environment. All users of the County of Prince Edward Public Library & Archives including users of the Library's Internet service, are also expected to follow the Library's Rules of Conduct, designed to ensure a welcoming environment. Disruptive, threatening, or otherwise intrusive behaviour is not allowed and Library Staff are authorized to take action. Violations of this Policy and/or the Rules of Conduct may result in suspension of Library privileges and exclusion from the Library, as well as prosecution.

Material viewed on the Internet must be generally acceptable. Unacceptable Internet conduct can include downloading copyrighted content and viewing material intended for mature adults. Patrons are encouraged to inform staff in the event they witness such content being viewed on a Library computer.
